## Laundry Room Etiquette

We have had several instances where we were approached asking what our rules are for laundry room etiquette. These inquiries were due to people leaving their clothes in the washers and/or dryers for an extended period of time. We thought it may be helpful if we provided some tips for laundry room etiquette.

### **Be Considerate: Be There When the Cycle is Finished**

It is very easy to get caught up in another task while you wait for your laundry to finish being washed, but keep track of the time. You should try to be back to the washing machine at least a couple minutes before the cycle has finished. Our washers take approximately 30 minutes to complete the load.

### **Removal of Other People's Clothes**

We hope that no one is put in this

position, however, if someone has left their laundry in the machines for more than 30 minutes, we feel that you have the right to remove their clothes and use the machine. PLEASE be considerate in doing so, however, and put the clothes either in the laundry cart, on the laundry table, or in the person's laundry basket.

### **Clean Out the Lint Trap**

The same rule applies in any public facility—clean up after yourself. Clean out the lint trap in the dryer, make sure that the dryer sheet finds the garbage, and pick up the little pieces of paper that didn't survive the washing process, etc.

### **Beware of Bleach**

Bleach can be a great thing, but use it cautiously. You don't want to use so much bleach that it isn't able to cycle through the machine properly and you don't want to spill it. Other people will be very upset if

that beautiful navy blue shirt comes out purple.

### **If You Find a Sock that Isn't Yours . . .**

Leave it on the laundry table. Don't throw it in the garbage. The person who lost the sock may come back and look for it. Wouldn't you be happy if you saw that a considerate person had left it for you to find?

### **Grease and Grime**

If you have clothes that are really filthy, whether covered with grease or with a terrible odor, don't just throw them into the machine. Try hand washing first taking the clothes to the dry cleaner's or take the laundry to some other professional. If you throw the filthy clothes into the public machines, other people's clothes can come out stained or smelling terrible.
